1.	Ulcerative colitis (UC) is inflammatory condition affecting part or all of large intestine, namely, colon and rectum.
2.	Its symptoms, which range from mild to severe, may occur in single episodes though frequent flare-ups are also common.
3.	This condition can be recognized by three classic symptoms: persistent diarrhea that is bloody and/or full of mucus, painful abdominal cramps inlower abdomen, and fever arising from inflammation.
4.	fatigue and loss of appetite and/or weight, in addition to other symptoms that are not directly colon-related, such as inflammation of the eyes may also occur.
5 .	UC is generally diagnosed by three tests: sigmoidoscopy, colonoscopy, or barium enema.
6.	sigmoidoscopy allows direct observation of the lower intestinal tract, i.e sigmoid colon and rectum, while colonoscopy permits examination of entire colon (up to the end of small intestine).
7.	third commonly used test, barium enema, involves series of x-rays that are taken once barium dye has been ingested.
8.	number of options are available for treatment.
9.	These include medications, such as 5-ASA compounds, steroids and immunosuppressants.
10.	alternative mind/body treatments, such as biofeedback, may also be suggested.
	However, patients with severe cases may requirecolonectomy, or removal of entire colon.
