The Cystoscopy Procedure

Prior to the actual procedure, the patient prepared. The patient is required fasting before going in for the procedure and brings along a companion to be driving him/her home after the procedure. At the doctor's office, the doctor and patient discusses the possible risks of cystoscopy; once this been completed, the patient asked to sign a consent form. Then, the patient changed into a hospital and told to empty his/her bladder. Additionally, antibiotics is given to prevents a urinary tract infection.

Next, the actual procedure, which performed by a urologist, begin. First, sedatives given to the patient to help him/her relax. Then, an intravenous needle are inserted in the patient's arm; this allow other medications and fluids to administration if necessary. The patient is then asked to be lain on his/her back with his/her legs apart. In the next step, a spinal anesthetic gives to removes sensation from the lower body. Once this has accomplished, the cystoscope placed into the urethra and moved to the bladder. A saline injection then put into the scope to expand the bladder. This give the doctor a clear view of the bladder. Next, medication administered via the scope to minimize the risk of infection. To allow the doctor to removes a tissue sample for biopsy, tiny instruments is then placed into the scope. When this completed, the cystoscope removes the body.

The final stage involving post-procedure care. During this stage, the patient met with the doctor, who revealed the results. S/he is allowed to be going home the same day but asked to rest and drinks a lot of fluids. The patient can resumes work the next day but should report to the doctor if any side effects, such as severe pain in the abdomen or pain during urination, occurred.
