In medical writing, the simple present tense is mainly used in two cases:

1)	facts or generalizations; something that is always true			
	Color blindness is a genetic disorder that most often occurs in males.			
	The kidney performs many vital functions.			

2) repeated or regular actions

To treat glaucoma, the doctor uses a laser to create a hole in the eye so that fluid can drain from it more easily.

In laparoscopy, a small incision is made in or just below the navel, and a needle is inserted into the abdomen.
