Dr. Tom Aretz is the Vice President for Global Programs at Partners HealthCare International (formally Harvard Medical International), the international arm of the Partners HealthCare System in Boston, which was founded by the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) and the Brigham and Women's Hospital.

Dr. Aretz is a native of Germany and received his MD degree from Harvard Medical School in 1977. He completed his Anatomic and Clinical Pathology Residency at the MGH in 1981, followed by a fellowship in CV Pathology at the MGH. He is an Associate Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School having directed a major second-year course there for 13 years.
