Gastroscopy: A Medical Procedure

Gastroscopy, a non-surgical technique used to help diagnose problems of the upper digestive tract, is carried out in three stages. First, the patient is prepared. During this stage, the patient fasts for six hours prior to the exam. The patient is asked to arrive early for his/her appointment so that s/he has enough time to fill out the registration forms, change his/her clothes, and complete other preoperative procedures. In addition, a companion is needed to accompany the patient as s/he will be sedated. Once these steps have been completed, an anesthetic is administered. The anesthetic prevents the patient from feelings any pain, stress or anxiety. It even helps remove the memory of the procedure without causing the patient to totally lose consciousness.

Next, the actual procedure begins. Throughout this stage, the well- being of the patient is monitored. This includes measuring the patient's blood pressure, oxygen level, and heart rate. To carry out the procedure, the doctor uses a gastroscope, which is a long, thin, flexible fiber optic tube that has a camera attached at the end. The gastroscope is inserted through the mouth; the doctor needs to make sure that it does not enter the windpipe and affect the patient's breathing. Additionally, a mouthpiece is placed between the teeth to relax the jaws. Next, the patient's stomach is gently filled with air. Once this has been completed, the doctor begins to inspect the lining of the esophagus, stomach, and duodenum. This part of the procedure takes approximately fifteen minutes. If necessary, at this point, specimens of the lining may be taken.
